A 250-pound hog will yield

approximately 120 pounds of retail cuts.

An 1,200 pound steer will yield approximately 490 pounds of retail cuts.

- lbs. chuck roasts and steaks lbs. round roasts and steaks 80 rib and loin steaks lbs.
- lbs. other cuts (brisket, flank, short ribs,
 - skirt steak)
- 185 lbs. Lean trim or ground beef

A 110-pound lamb will yield approximately 50 pounds of retail cuts.

An 85-pound goat will yield approximately 42.5 pounds of retail cuts.

- 12 lbs. leg of goat
 - lbs. loin roast or chops
 - lbs. spare ribs
- 11 lbs. shoulder roast
- 12.5 lbs. ground or stew

Two chickens weighing 20lbs will yield approximately 14 pounds of retail cuts.

- 4.8 lbs. thigh meat
- 4.4 lbs. breast Meat
- 4.8 lbs. drumsticks, wings, neck

Please note these are average yields based on industry data and cuts may vary by processor. Contact your processor after purchase to discuss cutting instructions.

What kind of animal can I buy?

4-H Meat Sale Market Hogs, Meat Goats, Chickens, Lambs, and Steers are young, grain fed animals bred by outstanding local beef, pork, chicken, sheep, and goat producers. The combination of grain feeding and young age for all sale animals, assures tender beef, pork, chicken, lamb, and goat.

How can I get the animal processed?

Several local slaughterhouses cooperate with the Meat Sale to provide prompt, individualized processing of purchased animals. All processing fees are at the expense of the buyer. Information concerning available slaughterhouses and their processing fees will be available online at cce.cornell.edu/chautauqua or by contacting those people listed under "For More Information" in this brochure.

How much should I pay for a 4-H animal?

Prices will vary based on competitive bidding and current market prices. However, 4-H members need a premium above market price to compensate for the individual care and management given to each animal.

I only need a quarter of beef or a side of pork, lamb, goat or just one chicken? How can I purchase an animal to fulfill my needs and also support the 4-H Livestock Program?

Meat processors can readily quarter or split sides of beef, pork, chicken, lamb, or goat. Join with a friend or business to purchase an animal to be sub-divided at processing.

How much meat will I get?

Retail yield will vary with the weight, finish, and size of the purchased animal. The quantity of specific retail cuts will vary according to your cutting instructions given to the meat processor. The figures given here should be considered as an approximate guide.

Terms of Sale

- All consigned animals sell at public auction beginning at 6:00pm Thursday, July 16th and ending at 6:00pm on Friday, July 17th, 2020. The sale will take place at Peterson Auction.com. This will not be a live auction. All lots will be open for bid for the duration of the sale.
- Interested buyers *must* register as a bidder with Peterson Auction. They may do so by visiting PetersonAuction.com or calling 716-665-0668.
- Terms of the sale are cash or check payable to "CCE." Buyers will be invoiced following the sale.
- All animals sell by the head. All slaughter and processing fees are the expense of the buyer. All sales are final. Auctioneer will settle any disputes on bids.
- 5. At the conclusion of the sale, the winning bidder will receive an email request to select a processing facility. Please select a processing facility immediately following the sale.
- The animals become the property of the buyer at the time of sale, but will remain in the care of the 4-H member until processing. Youth participants will provide trucking to an area slaughterhouse OR buyers can make their own arrangements. All 4-H Meat Animal Projects must leave the 4-Her's property alive.
- Pictures and promotional materials will be provided to buyers. 7.
- Sale Order: Animals will be listed on the website in this order: hogs, meat goats, chickens, lambs and steers.
- Animals cannot be donated back for resale. Buyers who wish to make a donation to a 4-H project area or to the general 4-H fund may do so via donation lots or by sending a donation directly to the 4-H Office.
