## PUBLIC PRESENTATION TIPS FOR PARENTS

You, as a 4-H parent, are a key person in making your child's 4-H membership a successful and rewarding experience. One of the times in 4-H when your child needs extra help is when Public Presentations draw near. This month, we'd like to list a few suggestions for you:

- 1. Suggest topics: allow your child to choose a topic, but if he/she is having trouble, offer some suggestions of things you know he/she has interest in.
- 2. Be interested in helping your 4-H'er learn, and show it.
- 3. Give generously of your support and encouragement which will help build confidence and excitement in your 4-H'er.
- 4. Be patient and offer to be an audience. A great deal of practice is needed before a member is prepared and confident for this big day. This may mean eating fruit salad for three weeks or listening a dozen times to an illustrated talk on electrical wiring. You can help by listening carefully and offering constructive criticism and encouragement.
- 5. Attend Public Presentation Day. Come with your child. Stay and watch others demonstrate. Your smiling face in the audience will have a calming effect on your 4-H'er.
- 6. Help him/her learn from the experience that it is meaningful. Together, review the evaluation sheet. Praise the things that were done well in the presentation and help him/her to understand how to improve aspects that need improvement.
